

Communications Law

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C. Articles must comply with the following specifications as the Editor will not undertake the re - typing of submissions which do not comply with Journal style.

1. Manuscripts should be supplied in a format compatible with standard word-processing packages, preferably MS Word. Manuscripts should be emailed to Dr Peter Coe (peter.coe@reading.ac.uk) with a copy to Ellie MacKenzie (ellie.mackenzie@bloomsbury.com). Please note that Bloomsbury Professional's Communications Law is a refereed journal, and details of the peer review policy are provided on the inside front cover.

2. Authors should keep at least one copy of their article.

3. Book titles should be in italics or underlined; articles/essays contained within should appear in single quotes. Periodicals should be given their standard abbreviations and should not be italicised eg LQR not Law Quarterly Review.

4. Law reports should appear using the standard abbreviations of their titles and should not be in italics or underlined. Full stops should not be used in case names, or law report citations. Abbreviations should be preceded by year (in square brackets where the year is an essential element, otherwise use round brackets) and volume number; page number(s) should follow abbreviation: (1991) 88 LGR 737–50.

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6. Italicise or underline words to appear in italics.

7. Spelling should comply with British, not American forms, eg -ise, not -ize, as in nationalise. Numbers one to twelve and per cent to be spelt out.
